It's time to start your dogs flea and tick regimen. We have been told that they are crazy around the river and ponds. If you have any questions as to what would be best please talk to your vet.

We had printed a notice about a Giardia vaccine, after more research and some conversations with our vets we have decided not to require it. If your dog has received it great, but too many vets feel it does not do enough to prevent it. Please be careful when letting your dogs drink from the lakes, rivers and standing water.

Lunch time; We do not give all daycare dogs a lunch break. If you would like your dog to have a lunch or just go down for a nap please let us know.

It's pool time! Yea!!!

We wanted to let you know that we will be putting out the pools when the weather is nice. If you are planning to pick up your pup before 4:30, they might be a little damp. (It is ok to ask us to give him a rub down with a towel).

Just like children in daycare dogs can pass around a cold. (sneezing and runny noses). If he has a fever and diarrhea then he might do better at home. The bordatella vaccine helps to prevent the spreading but does not guarantee it. Having the Bordatella vaccine done every 6 months is the best way to keep our dogs healthy. The annual vaccine tends to fade away around the 10<sup>th</sup> month.
